Elevator Upgrade Update:

The elevator upgrades were delayed one week due to some required permits needed. TK Elevator technicians began work on Monday Oct 28. To our delight they were able to start work without shutting down one of the elevators, allowing us an extra week with two elevators! You may hear them working on the 19th floor in the elevator room. On Monday November 4 we expect the elevator to be out of service for the next 2-3 weeks as they replace the hoist system. We will continue to communicate updates as we receive them by posting notices around the building, setting up update meetings in the Bistro and announcements during activities.

We thank everyone for their patience and understanding as we continue to work closely with TK Elevators to do the work with the least amount of disruption as possible.

Cold and flu season is here, and staff have been working hard to put in preventative measures to keep our community healthy. We have implemented our Enhanced Infection Prevention and Control Procedures which includes enhanced cleaning, reminders on hand hygiene and encouraging all staff and residents to get their flu and COViD vaccine. We ask that all staff and visitors self-monitor and refrain from entering the building if you have symptoms of illness. Residents who have flu symptoms will be supported to rest and get better in the comfort of their suite with meal deliveries and wellness checks.

We want to thank our in-house Pharmacist, Derek Lee, from Inlet Pharmacy for providing our Flu and COViD vaccine clinic at Rideau on October 24th, vaccinating 92 residents and staff in one day! Thank you to all the residents who received their immunizations to keep yourself and others safe, we currently have over 90% of the building with up-to-date immunizations.




